School Union #52 is comprised of the towns of Winslow, Vassalboro, and China which are geographically suburban and rural locations. Winslow is a residential suburb with approximately 8,000 residents. Located just east of the city of Waterville across the Kennebec River, Winslow features diverse yet expanding commercial development along its major corridors, U.S. Route 201 and State Route 137.

School

Built in 1964, Winslow High School is a public, comprehensive high school with approximately 489 students in grades 9-12. The school is accredited by the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and by the Maine Department of Educational and Cultural Services. Winslow High School has a current senior class enrollment of 140 students, and 83 professionals and support staff.
